INTRODUCTION

I hope you enjoy using these phonics flashcards. Below is the color code that helps students to remember which letters have multiple sounds.

COLOR CODE

Green cards are consonant letters with one sound and or are sometimes silent, **Yellow cards** are vowel sounds, **Blue cards** are consonant letters with two or more sounds. **Pink cards** are uniquely formed mixed sounds (consonant and vowel sounds). - Included are color code title cards that you can point to for reminders of what the colors mean.

PRINTING IDEA OPTIONS

- Print on Super Thick Card Stock, laminate (optional), then cut
- Print on Super Thick Card Stock, laminate (optional), then transfer to Adhesive Magnetic Sheet, then cut.
- Print on a printable thin Magnetic Sheet, then cut.
- Print on Super Thick Card Stock, (laminate optional), then transfer to Adhesive Craft Felt Sheet. (cheapest option for a thicker card)
- Other Laminating option: After cutting, place cards face down on a fat roll of clear tape, then cut again. Or place them in strips on the tape, then cut.
- Use magnetic cards with old cookie sheets or a magnetic board.
- Use felt cards with a flannel, felt board.

STORAGE IDEA

You have to organize your cards if you want to be able to use them because there are just TOO many. Purchase a pack of 3-hole punch business card holder plastic sleeves (1 page has 10 slots, 10 pages per pack, approximately \$3.50) and a 1.5 in. binder (in case you decide to order the diagramming cards to go with the FREE cards).

USING YOUR FREE TASK WHIZ PHONICS CARDS

1. As the teacher, build a word for the student.
2. After the word is complete, start with the **green cards** and ask the student to tell you the sound. Remind the student that these letters (or letter combinations) have only one sound or a few of them sometimes are silent (or sometimes unvoiced, as in "th") in a word.
3. Then have the student identify the **blue letters**. Remind the student that blue consonants have more than one sound. Talk about each blue letter, and applying phonics rules, help the student figure out the sound.

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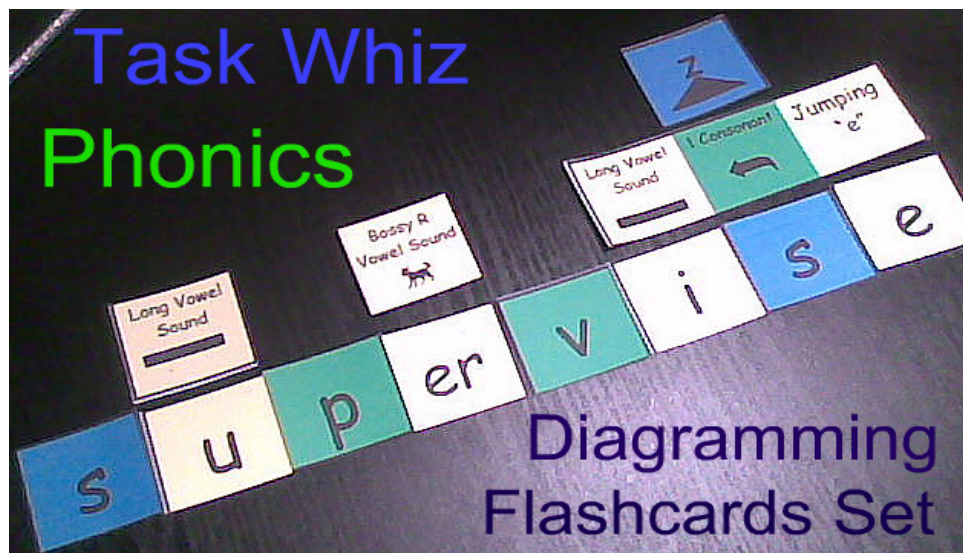
4. Then have the student identify the **yellow letters**. Remind the student that yellow letters are vowel sounds, and they have multiple sounds. Talk about each yellow letter, and applying phonics rules, help the student figure out the sound.
5. Then have the student identify any **pink cards**. Remind the student that these are common consonant-vowel sound combinations that they should recognize and know. Teach them those sounds.
6. Finally, from left to right, have the student blend the card sounds together.
7. Teach the student how to put letters back into their storage box.
